# III Chronicles, July 2023 Membership Meeting Summary Newsletter

## **Executive Board Summary**

- The Board worked with 3 topics the past 3 months: "Step by step with patience,"
   "Opening doors of thought," and "God is blessing our structure of Truth and Love."
- There has been an increase in visitors at the Reading Room, church services and Sunday School!
- The Second Town Hall meeting was held Saturday, May 6. A follow-up meeting is scheduled for **August 17 in the Sunday School at 7:00 p.m.** Motions will be considered at that time. A pertinent binder of articles for study is at the Reading Room.
- In Standing Rule 1, Section 2, C1, First Ballot: The Board moved to substitute the word "four" with the word "three" in the second sentence to read, "There must be at least three names." The motion passed.
- The Board expressed appreciation for the new committee chairs and their timely organizational meetings; the work of clerks, **Carol Horen** and **Charolyn Hudson**; the Treasurer along with the Financial Advisory Committee with their budget proposal; and each member of the church.
- Two new computers were acquired to replace the old outdated computers for the bookkeeper and clerk. A member donated one of them for the clerk!

#### Maintenance Matters, Tad Foster, Chair

t the end of November 2022, Doug Watkins, our custodian, was let go. We have shifted from seeking an employee to using contractors to do specific tasks including:

- Rod Martinez of Excel Cleaners cleans the church twice per month;
- A contractor to shovel snow:
- An electrician to change light bulbs;
- A company for window washing once per year:
- Mike's Lawn Service to mow weekly and aerate, fertilize and apply herbicide. The lawn is improving!
- Vibrant Gardens to weed and maintain the gardens;
- Dignity Fire Protection Company to:
  - A. Monitor the Fire Alarm System
  - B. Annually inspect the alarm system, the wet sprinkler system, the 4 antibackflow devices in the church and Reading Room, the fire extinguishers in both places.

#### We are seeking:

- **A qualified plumber** to do the summer boiler and steam heating system maintenance.
- A bid from a sole concrete contractor who previously repaired the Sunday School steps where they spaul and chip off. We may need a special meeting to approve the bid.
- A volunteer on Sunday morning before the service to use an electric blower to clear debris from S.S. porch and steps, then sidewalks and front entrance.
- Seeking bids to repair a failed anti-backflow device in the church.
- The heating system in the foyer's south tower has been repaired and the blower in the north tower will need replacement. We are thinking about using a maintenance management company. That is about \$800/month (as a good deal) or \$9,600 a year which is on top of the costs of the contractors.
- Someone to oversee the plumbing repairs and maintenance.
- More members on this committee.

We do not know if this approach is cheaper than what it would cost to have a custodian as an employee, but we feel we are getting things done and done well! Thanks to **Charles Hotchkiss** for managing Dignity Fire's inspections and Vibrant Garden's work; thanks to Susan Larsen for overseeing the cleaning service; thanks to **Ken Rubel** for diligently draining the boilers nearly every week; thanks to Walt Hieronymus for finding contractors, picking up things omitted, and assisting in many ways.

The Monitor Gifts committee renewed subscriptions Monitor Gifts Report, Susan Butler, Chair for 5 public libraries that were discontinued during COVID restrictions. New subscriptions began April,

2023. Subscriptions for 2 high schools as well as the El Paso County jail were not renewed due to lack of usage and receptivity. We continue outreach to our community by distributing literature to various laundromats and retirement communities. A special thanks to Lori Doutrich for leading this endeavor. We welcome suggestions for additional locations. We are once again able to receive literature that you would like to contribute. There is a basket in the foyer for your contributions. Thanks to Lori and Lynn's outreach, we were able to send some literature to the Boulder church for distribution to their local jail system. Spreading the word and reaching out to our community remains the focus of the Monitor Gifts committee.



## Treasurer: 2023-24 Fiscal Budget, Susan Larsen, Treasurer

The Treasurer reviewed the Quarterly Assets and Liabilities and Profit and Loss YTD. The average shortfall of \$2K each month is covered by income from our unrestricted investment account. We could increase our contributions so that we are not transferring from the investment accounts. Also, we may consider adjustments to our expenses. We would like our investments to earn a steady return rate.

The **Treasurer presented the Proposed Budget for October 2023 – September 2024.** Several operational increases and decreases were noted but overall, the Operations Endowment and the Wakerly Trust Endowment investment incomes will help to alleviate shortfalls. Use of the investment funds to supplement income was explained. **The Budget motion passed.** The motion passed to use up to \$17,494 in the current value of the Operations Endowment principle next year. We welcome members to learn more about our finances and provide input by joining the **Financial Advisory Committee.**
